
















Challenges

AGING SOCIETY

Leading Country

In 2021, the aged population (65 years old and over) was 36.21 million, constituting 28.9 percent of the total population (i.e., 1 in every 4 persons)

RURAL DEPOPULATION

Shrinking Country/Countrysides

Japan's population is set to lose up to one-third of its population, down to 88 million people, by 2065

DISCRIMINATION

Nail that sticks out

Blackface NHK still allowed to go on air, suicide associated with mixed as well as immigrant popoulation.

CLIMATE CHANGE

Sinking Island

In 2021, the aged population (65 years old and over) was 36.21 million, constituting 28.9 percent of the total population (i.e., 1 in every 4 persons)

IMMIGRATION/REFUGEES

Closed Borders

Japan accepted 47 refugees in 2020, three more than the previous year and only 1.2% of individuals applying for refugee status in the country

INVISIBLE POVERTY

Lower job security & culture

Middle-aged and elderly people comprised 95% of the homeless population.



Disappearing Municipalities

In a report published in 2014, cities and Towns whose population of young females (29-40yrs) are predicted to half by 2040. These cities are also facing fewer children in school, no tax base and an elderly population - Nanmoku for example is the oldest town in Japan and are at risk of disappearing.

Out of 1,740 municipalities, guess how many are on this list?




896 out of 1741 municipalities

Over half of all municipalities are predicted to disappear - not discounting municipalities that are shrinking from natural disasters or climate crises. Three areas, in particular, are exacerbated. This led to the creation of the Regional Revitalization Agency (地方創生)

- Decline in **food security** affects our forests
- Declining biodiversity affects our **economy**
- A weakening economy affects our health
- --> exacerbates both urban and rural areas globally

Guaranteed Income

Keep your important update in short, tight headers so it's easy to skim.

Guaranteed Housing

Housing is guaranteed during this time, often being 3-4 bedrooms vs. Tokyo spaces 1BR.

Local stakeholder buy-in and support

These municipalities will have had local stakeholder buy-in however it is still targeted to Japanese nationals.

Knowledge x Labour

Archive Local Knowledge through Experiences

Day 1: Participants listen to local villagers, document information

Day 2: Support seasonal labour and create curricula based on local history, particularly women.

Day 3: Create media assets to be used towards the next event.

Academia - International Partnership for the Satoyama Initiative (IPSI)



Environment as infrastructure

Ultramarathons as a compliment to triennial

Partnerships with local forestry experts, document land history and map paths.

Funding from existing ultramarathon organizers, advocates and community groups.

Collaborative clearing over 6 months with avid runners.



Prototyping Rural Life

Making real estate and experiences accessible


Short-stay: Similar to airbnb experiences, people can stay for a weekend to eat, farm, rest.

Apprenticeship: Seasonal support across the seasons, more mid-long term stay


Migration: Purchasing of land, securing employemnt







Age-related Diseases in Japan



Orange Plan

Introduced in 2015, the government released the Orange plan to tackle dementia (drugs, caregiving, space)

2025 timeline

More than 7million people will have dementia - one in five Japanese people aged over 65yrs.

Resourcing

Not just healthcare workers but also surrouding community - National Police Agency reported that 12K people went missing - 150 never found, 479 dead.

Mobility as a Service


Data-driven preventative health

Pick-up service that takes advantage of pick-up vehicles owned by nursing care facilities.

Users are able to book appointments via an app to go directly to the doctor or book virtually.

Services delivered via drone/autonomous vehicles and optimizing for latent vehicles/exising transport routes

Dementia Towns


Comprehensive Community Support Centres (CCSC)


"Take the community as hospital, their home is hospital bed and the streets are hospital corridor" - Tsuyoshi Koyama


Growth of Agetech

Akiya

Rural housing is extremely cheap and government subsidized. By 2030, 1/3 all Japanese homes will be vacant.

Autonomous land ownership

Only country in the world where you can own the land outright without needing to be a resident or citizen.

Tech-forward

Strong bias towards tech, Japan is planning to be the first government in the world to have an NFT task force and minister of web3.

DAOs

DAOs bottom-up entity structure with no central authority. Members of a DAO own tokens of the DAO, and members can vote on initiatives for the entity. Smart contracts are implemented for the DAO, and the code governing the DAO's operations in publicly disclosed.




Leveraging Technology
